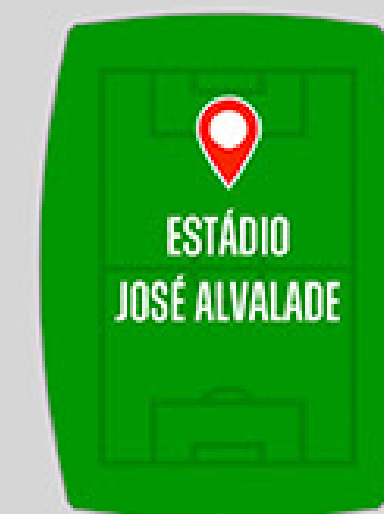

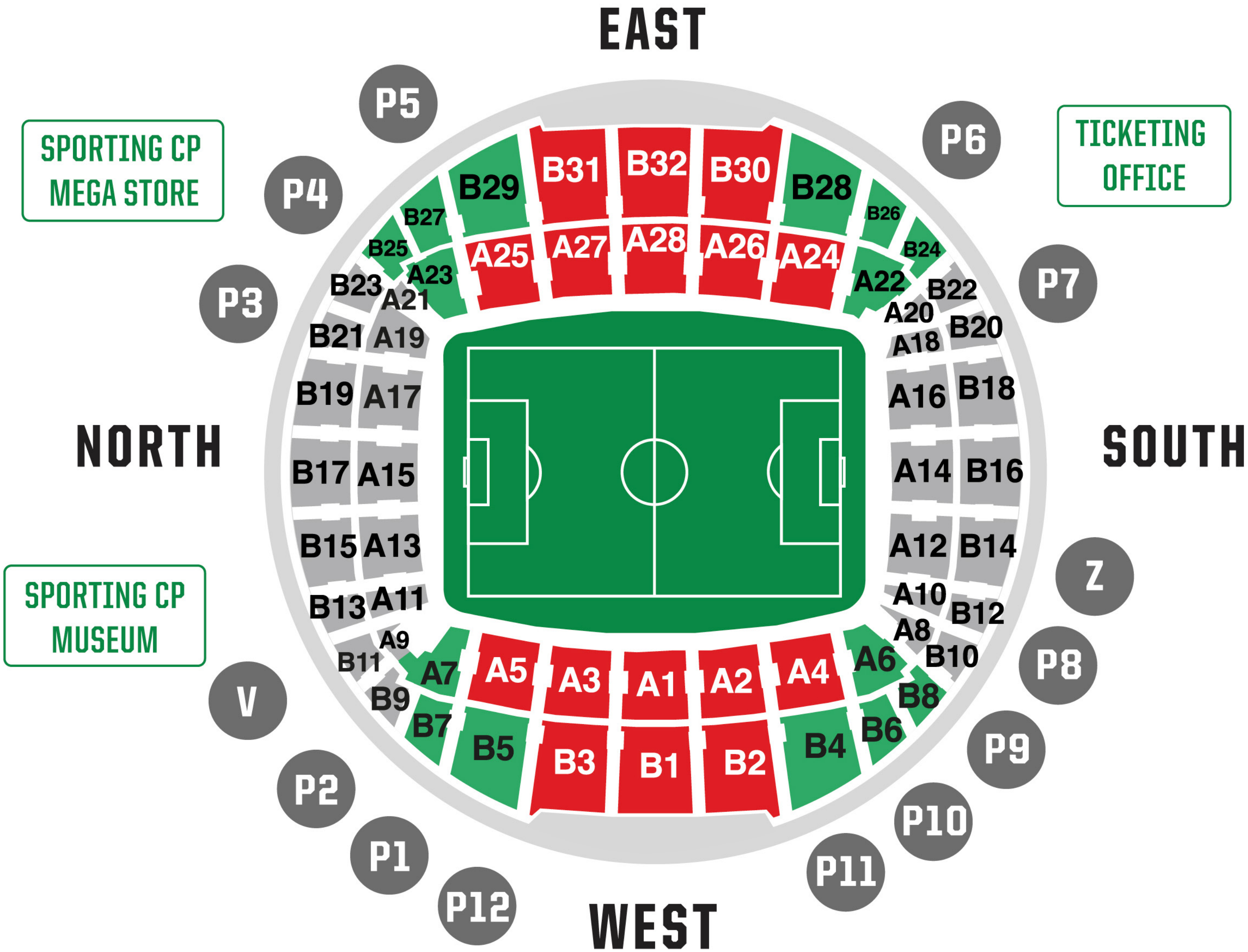

# FORBIDDEN ITEMS

## FLAGS AND BANNERS

Flags/banners are not allowed inside\*.

## BACKPACKS/BAGS

Backpacks/bags larger than A4 size are not permitted, and there is no storage available.

## ENTRY OF MINORS

Children under the age of 3 are not allowed to enter the stadium. Children between the ages of 3 and 6 must have a signed liability waiver, available [here](#).

## INSIDE THE STADIUM

Food and drinks will be available inside the stadium. As it is a cashless venue, only card or contactless payments are accepted.

\*Flags/banners or other stadium materials (e.g., drums, megaphones) may be allowed, subject to prior approval from the competent authorities. Requests must be submitted at least two weeks in advance to [apoio.adepto@fpf.pt](mailto:apoio.adepto@fpf.pt)



Purchase your tickets through the official channels of the Portuguese Football Federation or the visiting federation to avoid scams, counterfeit tickets, or duplicate entries.

The Portuguese Football Federation emphasizes that it is not responsible for any transactions made through unofficial websites (such as ViaGoGo or StubHub, which act as resale platforms for this event) or social media channels, and strongly advises against using these platforms.

Purchasing tickets through unofficial channels carries a high risk of being denied entry

to the stadium. The use of unauthorized platforms is prohibited by law, and individuals identified may face legal consequences.

We will maintain active surveillance and continue to report to the competent authorities any platform, website, or contact involved in the illegal sale of tickets, taking all necessary legal measures.

Identified cases may result in the temporary or permanent suspension of ticket purchasing privileges for future National Team matches.

## BACALHAU À BRÁS

Codfish is one of the most typical dishes of Portugal, with “Bacalhau à Brás” being one of the most famous recipes. Made with shredded codfish, matchstick potatoes, scrambled eggs, and onions, it is a Portuguese delight.

## PASTÉIS DE NATA

The famous “Pastéis de Nata” are made with puff pastry and egg cream filling. They are irresistible, usually served warm and sprinkled with cinnamon and powdered sugar.
